



Private Pilot Information

NOTE: Costs of ratings (pilot licenses) will vary depending on an individual's pace and training needs. Scenario 1 below includes more than minimum hours of airplane rental and instruction to offer a helpful picture of the costs of training. Scenario 2 includes the legal minimum hours to show how economical flight training can be.

The costs in a 4-seater airplane (Cessna 172):

SCENARIO 1 (more than legal minimum hours): **\$12,439.00 Total**

- 60 Hours Plane Rental (\$8,400.00)
- 45 Hours Instruction (\$2,925.00)
- King Study Materials (\$364.00)
- Testing Fees (\$750.00)

SCENARIO 2 (legal minimum hours): **\$8,014.00 Total**

- 40 Hours Plane Rental (\$5,600.00)
 - 20 Hours Instruction (\$1,300.00)

Training Outline:

You will watch the Cessna Training Center videos at your leisure to acquire the knowledge required to pass the FAA written test bringing any unanswered questions to your flight lesson. The test can be done at any time during the rest of your flight training.

The first stage of your training will give you the skills to solo the plane safely.

The second stage of your training will help you master cross-country flying, and will give you skill sets like navigation and proper radio procedures away from the Danville airport.

The third and final stage of your training will prepare you for your FAA check-ride or practical test.
